The prelude is a setting of the middle hymn, "Lo. How a Rose E'er Blooming." It is from a set of eleven meditative preludes for organ by German composer Johannes Brahms. That set of preludes was the last composition he wrote.


[Silence for reflection and self-examination]

SECOND READING: Hebrews 10:5-10

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.



Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional Fourth Sunday of Advent – December 19, 2021

"...my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..." (Luke 1:47)

Here we read the birth of Jesus in song and poetry. Zechariah hears he is going to be a father, and sings. Mary hears she is going to be a mother, and sings. Elizabeth sings, Simeon sings, everybody seems to be singing.

In your own life you are moving through your repetitive, ordinary day, when suddenly there is a phone call. Some good news comes and what is your first response? You sing with joy and for the rest of the day you are singing or humming a song that gets stuck in your head.

Would you be able to sing if you were Mary? Being unexpectedly pregnant is not something she could explain or understand. It was not something Mary chose or planned ahead of time. She was in a bad way with her fiancé and the public, and motherhood was not exactly a great outlook, and yet, Mary sang.

There are people who have lost their joy and ability to sing. If you are hurt enough, defeated, strapped, and pushed around, before long you become withdrawn, quiet, silent. It's what happens when death comes to a family. People become traumatized, speechless, and silent. What is there to say in such terrible times? We keep silent.

But what does the church do? We sing Amazing Grace with tears in our eyes. We sing when we don't feel like it. Singing is pure defiance. It is faith with a clenched fist singing right up in the face of death. Death hates music and death doesn't want us singing.

There will be dark days ahead for Mary. Her joy will be mixed with pain. Mary will weep for her son. But for now, her faith enables her to sing. Your life is not all Christmas carols and pure joy either. Dark days may be ahead of you. But for now, our faith enables us to sing. We sing because we believe, we believe because we sing.

Joy is a Christmas gift to us from a God who never leaves us alone, who intrudes on us, and who creates pure joy in the heart. Sometimes we experience so much of the presence of God that we never stop singing. Our prayers become like breathing, even in the worst circumstances, we dare to give thanks, we dare to rejoice, and we dare to have joy in our hearts. We dare to sing! *Amen*.
