

• A Long-Range Ministry Planning team will be meeting after late services, usually twice each month, for the next five months. Please consider being part of the team. The following is their purpose statement:

To fulfill St. John's mission statement in the coming years to the best of our abilities as a congregation and to the glory of Jesus Christ, we will:

#### engage in a five month process of:

- Prayer
- Assessment of strengths and areas of challenge
- Assessment of leadership needs (lay and professional)
- Assessment of our current cultural (Grove City and American) context
- Assessment of needs and points of engagement with our local community
  - Discernment of God's will for St. John's in our current context

And, based on the results of this process, formulate a five-year ministry plan with measurable goals and the lay and staff leadership necessary to reach our goals.

Anyone who has a heart for ministry planning is strongly encouraged to become part of the Long-Range Ministry Planning Team!

- As part of Long-Range Ministry Planning, the entire congregation will be invited to attend one or two *cottage meetings* in September, to share ideas and brainstorm for ministry (dates TBD). We need to hear your thoughts and dreams for St. John's, so please come!
- The 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Team has put together a list of special events to mark this milestone 2024 year, including:
  - Musical Concerts
  - o Special Worship Services (e.g. upcoming German Heritage)
  - o Guest Preachers (including some former pastors of St. John's)
  - o Temple talks by St. John's members
  - o Video presentations from longtime members of St. John's
  - o Honoring the Saints of St. John's who have entered into eternal life
  - o Historical pictorial presentation in the new North entrance
  - Re-dedication service and Celebration Lunch on Reformation Sunday, October 27<sup>th</sup>

- Confirmation instruction orientation sessions are scheduled for late August. If you know parents of any students entering 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grades, please let them know that our confirmation classes are open to all.
- As you know from the quarterly meeting agenda today, the church council is recommending that St. John's hire an external agency to facilitate our search for a new youth minister. Please pray for our Youth Minister Search Team as they search for potential candidates to fill a vitally important leadership position in our congregation.
- Council continues to work on providing a safety/security policy for the congregation.
- Promise Keepers, our regular men's Bible discussion group, is meeting every Thursday at 8:00 a.m. Currently we're working through the Gospel of Mark.
- Pastor Patti and I appreciate being notified when church members have been hospitalized or are dealing with health issues.
- Staff and administrative duties are going well.
- As always, I am available for conversation and/or pastoral care, any time (217.255.2118)

#### Meetings

Pastor Patti and I continue to meet on a weekly basis. Our discussions have included sermon preparation, funeral arrangements, personal growth and family care, and loving the congregation as Christ does. I am glad and grateful to have her as my Internship Supervisor. Pastor Seth and I continue to meet regularly to discuss the ins and outs of ministry: leading a congregation, direction, planning, and his experiences. Their time and candor have greatly benefited me - even in the few months we have been meeting.

The Internship Committee comes together each month to discuss my experiences. This wonderful group has helped me find areas of ministry in which I can concentrate my efforts to grow. Each meeting they come with helpful ideas, good insights, and honesty. I feel increasingly more prepared to minister to a congregation with their support. I continue to meet with the staff each Monday and the Church Council each month. These experiences of hearing concerns, coordinating with others, and discussing issues and solutions have been invaluable for one preparing for ordination.

#### Grief Share

The first 13-week session of Grief Share wrapped up several weeks ago. It was a blessing to spend each Tuesday afternoon with a sincere and compassionate group of people. It was an amazing time of healing and growing closer to the Lord and each other. We plan to make this ministry of consolation and healing available on an on-going basis – beginning the next session in the fall. #### Sunday School

I continue to attend and help lead the Sunday School group which meets in the old fellowship hall as often as possible. This is a wonderful, friendly, and inquisitive bunch with whom Rosalind and I love spending Sundays. They have been very helpful and patient with an intern who is learning how to conduct a Bible study. I appreciate their shared joy in lifting one another up in prayer and love, as well as their delight in discussing the Bible.

Recently, I had the opportunity to be a substitute Sunday School teacher for the 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Grade class. The organization with which the Sunday School program is run is evident in the conduct of the kids. I have never been in such a delightful and well-prepared class for this age level!

#### Youth

I have joyfully taken part in several activities with the youth of St. Johns. The Service Camp for the older kids at St. Johns was a delight to attend. I was able to get to know some kids with whom I had not previously talked. We learned about service, being and showing Christ's light to others in a dark world. It was wonderful working alongside these young sisters and brothers in Christ at Bed Brigade. I had heard much about this ministry and have been impressed with what I heard. I was even more impressed with what I saw! The dedicated crew was able to orient the youth to their jobs, instruct them

well, and complete about 40 beds in a short amount of time. The hands-on experience each teenager received will stick with them for years, I know.

I was able to help out with VBS this June. The planning behind the scenes was incredible and instructive to behold! Pastor Seth allowed me to tag along with his group of older kids and even lead a lesson on Day 2. The mixture of fun and learning was fantastic! My family and I have also participated in Joyful Pause days. It was delightful to have this time with my kids and other families. It is also so unique and simple. I hope to take the spirit in which such events are planned to my next call.

#### Worship

I have had more opportunities to help lead in both Traditional and Contemporary services. This experience has helped me grow increasingly comfortable with being in front of a congregation. Additionally, I have been able to preach in both Traditional and Contemporary services. I appreciate each opportunity to preach God's Word to His beloved people. I pray that our Lord has blessed you through these times as He has me.

Not only at St. Johns have I been able to worship and preach, but also in other congregations in our Mission District! I have attended and spoken at Grace Lutheran Church in Thornville, Grace Lutheran Church in Springfield, and St. John Lutheran Church on Broad St. (twice). I will continue the trajectory of visiting a new congregation each month (at least) for the remainder of my year in Grove City. As I have stated before, the opportunity to be with multiple congregations is a unique experience for a pastoral intern. I appreciate your generosity in sharing me among our sister congregations in the NALC.

I have had other delightful events and opportunities this past quarter, as well: I attended the Mission District/Region Convocation. It was wonderful to be among so many brothers and sisters of the NALC. The volunteers who organized and hosted the event at St. Johns did a fantastic job of welcoming a large crowd! I have been able to talk with active and retired pastors in the area and hear of their experiences in ministry. How vital it is to hear about all the ups, downs, and surprising challenges and blessings ministry holds! I have been welcomed at the OWLS gatherings where good food, warm conversations, and interesting speakers abound!

Opportunities to visit homebound members have also been wonderful. It is a blessing for me to spend time with members of St. Johns in their homes and rooms. Accompanying the Homebound Communion Team has been a real joy! I have also become the chaplain for our Boy Scout troop. I look forward to helping these young men grow in their faith as they grow in their knowledge and skills.

Finally, I formally received my degree of Master of Divinity from the North American Lutheran Seminary in May. Thank you for all the expressions of joy and support I have received these past months!
